Where is your place at table?

Many of you will have visited the Great Hall in Winchester and seen suspended on the end wall this magnificent table top, reputed to be that of King Arthur. It is said to have been in this position for 500 years. Henry VIII knew of it and, it's thought, had his image and the Tudor Rose added. There are spaces on this table for 25 knights and all their names are listed.

The myth/legend of King Arthur goes back a long way in time, and has its roots in both Welsh and English history. Arthur was reportedly a 'tribal' leader in the 5th or 6th century, but the stories have benefited from telling and re-telling, (a bit like the legend of Robin Hood). The stories were rooted in morality and ethics, as well as a good dose of romance. The most familiar images are of medieval knights, bent on special missions, involving much bravery and derring-do. These were favourite topics for the Pre-Raphaelite artists of Victorian times. Hollywood, of course, has got into the mix in modern times, with much panache.

The issue of the 'round table' is crucial to its shape. Apart from the king, no-one had superiority; there was equality of importance and hierarchies did not exist.

Palestine in the days of Jesus was very different. Party etiquette was significant. Elbowing for position at table was not unusual. Social invitations were influenced by social norms and expectations; relationships that needed to be 'oiled' and 'caressed'. In first century Palestine your rank was reinforced by your place at table!

When Jesus is invited to a banquet (Luke Chap 14), he uses the occasion to caution those present that they may not be as important or superior in God's eyes. A humble approach to seating at the 'heavenly banquet' may be more necessary for them (and us). God might invite you and me to the banquet, but beware, he might ask us to give up our seat to one of the homeless that we can see on Winchester streets, or to a refugee who has just landed on the Kent coast, or to a young girl who has been trafficked.

When Bishop JV Taylor began at Winchester, his mitre was carried on a cushion in front of him, to acknowledge the awesome nature of the call to be shepherd of God's people. He wanted to deflect attention from the wearer. He also rejected Wolvesey Palace in favour of a council house to express a genuine desire to be seen as a fellow traveller.

Embracing the 'way of Christ' is challenging. It involves humility. A word without much modern influence or understanding I fear.

Cost: 2 courses £30 or £37 for 3 courses.


