

We recently attended a family funeral, and although the family concerned are not overtly "religious", they were keen to include the hymn 'The Old Rugged Cross' ."The Old Rugged Cross" is a popular hymn written in 1912 by evangelist and song-leader George Bennard and it speaks of the writer's adoration of Christ and His sacrifice at Calvary. (Wikipedia). The deeper meaning of the cross in Christianity lies in its representation of Jesus' sacrifice and ultimate victory over sin and death. It symbolizes God's love, for-giveness, and the hope of eternal life offered through faith in Jesus Christ. The cross also represents the intersection of God's justice and mercy, where He delivers both punishment for sin and salvation for those who believe. In our small group at King's Somborne, we have been considering paradoxes within the Bible stories, what a paradox Easter presents to us! So what does this mean for us at Easter? How can we use such a sacrifice to generate a positive outlook for the future?

Easter is a time for reflection on renewal and hope, offering a chance to consider how Jesus' resurrection impacts our lives and the world. It's a period to examine personal growth, renew faith, and embrace the promise of new beginnings, even amidst challenges.

Easter symbolizes a rebirth and a fresh start. It's an opportunity to examine past actions and make conscious choices for a more positive future. We should consider what aspects of our lives we would like to renew or change, aligning with the spirit of Easter.

We can personally reflect and take time for prayer and contemplation, allowing ourselves to connect with the spiritual significance of Easter. We can reflect on our relationship with God and how we can deepen our faith. How can we live out the principle of love, forgiveness and hope in our daily lives?

Easter is a time for fellowship and community, sharing the joy of the resurrection with loved ones. We can consider how we can extend compassion and support to those in need, mirroring the love and compassion of Jesus.

As we walk through Easter week, let us never forget the sacrifice made for us by Jesus on the cross. Let that memory harness our enthusiasm to share the positive news that comes from Easter Day.



We would be delighted to welcome anyone from any of our churches , to any of these services.

Envelopes will be available in all our churches for those who would like to contribute to the Methodist Church World MIssion Fund which supports the work of Mission Partners in a variety of places across the world, and enables emergency support when significant crises occur. The Methodist Church of Britain World Mission Fund (WMF) offers support to 107 partner churches and organisations in Africa, Europe, Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia and the Pacific

Mission Partners are initially trained in this country and invited to serve for periods of at least one year. Currently:

Keith and Ida Waddell are based in Mwandi, Zambia . Keith is a teacher at Mwandi Basic School; Ida is a nurse working predominantly in HIV/AIDS care.

Revd Rachel and Revd Sylvester Deigh are in Gambia.

Sylvester is based in the connexional office working on shaping training for local preachers, probationers, and ministers.

Rachel is involved in circuit work, particularly helping to develop and strengthen the children and women ministries; and training and mentoring ordinands and preachers

General or Solidarity Grants are a rapid response that express solidarity in partnership to a partner who is facing particularly difficult circumstances or an emergency situation

In Sri Lanka in 2024 strong winds and flooding due to monsoon rains caused devastation. The WMF gave a grant of £15,000 which enabled the National Christian Council of Sri Lanka to provide temporary shelter and food for the most vulnerable displaced individuals and families.

Capacity Building Grants enable partner churches to strategically build their capacity and resources to become self -sustaining.

In Zimbabwe the Rev. Dr. Noleen Chinyere's PhD studies were funded by the World Mission Fund . She is now the first woman in the Methodist Church in Zimbabwe to be awarded a PhD, AND the first woman to be appointed Vice Principal at the United Theological College.


Nationals in Mission Appointments encourage and support local people in key mission projects in their own countries. There are over 100 NMA's working with partners around the world.

In Estonia Ele Paju is developing the youth ministry in the Methodist Church in Estonia, training youth leaders and running a camp for teenagers.

In Ghana Dr Ni-Addo Bruce works with Buruli ulcer patients, providing preventative and curative solutions. Over Easter time there will be Easter Offering envelopes available in church, inviting you to support the work of the Methodist Church of Britain World Mission Fund.


