Ordinary and Extraordinary

He had escaped. Now he saw them everywhere; not his harassers but idols.

Paul's reflex response was to be deeply distressed (Acts 17:16). His radical response was to speak the Gospel in the commercial noise of Athens market-place and the considered worship of its synagogue - so much so that he became extraordinarily visible to those in governing control of the city (the Areopagus) who then summoned him to give account of the meaning of "Jesus and Resurrection" (Acts 17:18).

As regards Paul's speaking, on his own admission it was ordinary (2 Corinthians 10:10; 11:6); key was that it was under commission of the Holy Spirit (Acts 13:2).

As regards idols, I like this quote by CS Lewis:

"God knows how to describe himself

much better than we know how to describe him."

The small groups at Wesley have been working through a series called "Names of God". One of its studies included this challenging thought:

"It is very easy to confuse how we prefer to think of God with how God wants to reveal Himself to us... we ... need to pray that we will be open to hearing and seeing what He wants us to hear and see."

Last Saturday afternoon a number gathered at Wesley to be led by Revd Dr Howard Mellor on the theme of "Being Alive to the Holy Spirit". We were helped to recognise this as ordinary (normative) for committed followers of Jesus; with the fruit and gifts (inspiration / demonstration / revelation) of the Spirit being both ordinary and extraordinary. We shared our (ordinary) responses to different names given to the Spirit; and in reflecting on the seal of the Spirit (Ephesians 1:13) were helped to realise this as being indicative of the continuing presence of God in those of faith.

As we see things in our prevailing culture which evoke reflex responses of deep disturbance, may our radical responses include:

- -giving thanks and praying for those of faith who, under commission of the Spirit, engage in public debate in both ordinary places of everyday encounter and extraordinary places of accountable governance, on behalf of the Gospel;
- -reflecting on our part in carrying the Gospel message into whatever ordinary or extraordinary places we find ourselves, just speaking in ways ordinary to us.

We also heard on Saturday of the Holy Spirit as "Parakletos"; one meaning of which is Advocate, illustrated as one coming alongside to "whisper in the ear".

So, whether our day be ordinary or extraordinary, may we go on listening for those "whispers in the ear" of the Holy Spirit alert to "hearing what God wants us to hear".

Churches Together in Winchester Opportunities to serve

We have two opportunities to serve Churches Together in Winchester and work with the new Chair, Revd Marianne Foster.

These are crucial roles but not onerous in terms of time. They are:

Secretary

Preparing with the Chair agendas, taking Minutes and sending information to member churches and partner organisations.

Forwarding various requests for help from various partner organisations eg Street/School pastors, Basics Bank, The Night shelter.

Liaising with other external organisations who contact Churches Together.

The Secretary is a member of the Steering group – this is a coordinating role supporting the work of the Council and working with the Chair of Churches Together.

Communications

Ensuring the website and social media are up to date with information about Churches Together.

Reviewing comments on either the website or social media feeds and approving/deleting regularly as necessary.

Receiving information from churches and partner organisations which need to be promoted. Deciding which need to be promoted where and when. (Previously there has been a policy of only promoting free events.)

Information

The Council of Churches Together (CTiW), meets, normally, three times a year one of which will be the AGM. In the last two years it has met termly. The Council makes policy, and its decisions are acted upon by the Steering Group.

The Steering Group is a smaller meeting of key clergy and lay people who often undertake business by WhatsApp and email though they are met once a year in each of the last two years.

Revd Marianne Foster is the new Chair since the June 2024 AGM. She introduced herself in a recent CTiW Update and this is included on page two of this document.

CTiW is a charity and submit accounts to the Charity Commission. The Treasurer of CTiW is Bob Lord.


As I step into this new role, I am praying that our unity will be a beacon of hope and a witness to the transformative power of the Gospel.
