What value have these plastic bricks?



Did you know? Lego is the world's largest toy manufacturer. On August 10th 2022, they celebrated their 90th Anniversary. Lego is best known for these little plastic bricks; however, the Lego company is the world's largest tyre manufacturer, the mini variety, and they produce over 700 million of them a year! The multi-coloured bricks can be seen everywhere, not surprising as there are over 400 billion around the world.

From 1932, Ole Kirk Christiansen, founder of Lego, began his career as making wooden toys, step ladders and ironing boards! Today, the company is valued at over £7157700000 but Lego, which derives from the Danish word "leggodt", meaning to "play well", had a rollercoaster beginning. Shortly after Ole Kirk sold his finely made wooden toys, he lost his wife Kristine. He was left with four sons to bring up and as a family they struggled for many years. As if that wasn't enough to contend with, in 1942 a factory fire destroyed everything, including his blueprints and stock. Showing immense courage, Ole Kirk rebuilt and was excited to learn that a plastic moulding machine had been newly invented and having been sent some plastic bricks, he replicated them and so in 1949, the modern-day plastic bricks were produced.

The word "Lego" in Latin means "I put together" or "I assemble". Ole Kirk credited his resilience and success to the fact that he was a devout Christian. He lived out his faith in many ways, he prayed daily with his workers, he taught in Sunday School, and he was an active member of the YMCA/YWCA. He and his family also funded the building of a church. Ole Kirk's son Gotfred, who succeeded him as head of the company, said this of his father:

"I am convinced that Father's faith in God, which was evident in everything he did, helped carry him through his grief and the difficulties that followed. His faith made him an active man, it gave him courage to take on new responsibilities – and the strength to see a job through despite hardship."

John Kraemer works on constructing Lego people-sized parishes and churches. John suffers from cerebral palsy and as he grew, his faith became very important to him. He decided to construct churches out of Lego bricks, complete with people in pews, doors and windows and an altar. As John builds, he prays for the Church, for those with disabilities and everyone struggling to find a place in the Church. He believes that Christians are called to evangelise in their own creative ways and that there is always hope in the face of darkness.

In 1 Peter 2:9-10, he says "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvellous light", a signpost for the church today. A church can be distorted, burned out and the people in it hard to fit together sometimes. We are not a perfect stone or piece of Lego, but we are assured that God is at work and our church continues to be built. Acknowledging that, we should let God continue his work and go where he leads us.

BANANAS



Most of us enjoy eating a banana!but where was it grown?.....did the farmers get a fair price?

Our local supermarkets usually display that they are selling Fairtrade bananas – but what is Fairtrade? Together with Fairtrade farmers and workers, Fairtrade has a vision in which trade is based on fairness, so that producers earn secure and sustainable livelihoods. It protects workers' rights and the environment. Almost one in three bananas sold in the UK is Fairtrade. Sainsbury, alone, sell an incredible 650 million Fairtrade bananas a year – enough to go around the world three times!

When you are shopping look out for the Fairtrade label on the bananas, but keep on looking in other aisles, as there are many other products, which Fairtrade certify. For example, all our local supermarkets sell their tea and coffee products. M&S and Waitrose pride themselves on selling more than 200 products. Tesco, Sainsbury and Aldi also sell a huge variety of Fairtrade products. Be on the lookout for jams, sugar and fresh vegetables.

Fairtrade cover key areas for environmental protection, including greenhouse gas reduction, soil and water quality and biodiversity protection. They also give a better quality of life for the producers. We can all play a small part in the vision of Fairtrade, if we think about what goes into our shopping basket!



An Invitation to Watch 'The Chosen' – a TV biography of Jesus Christ

This is an invitation to join friends at The United Church Winchester, at 7.00 pm on Wednesday the 5th, 12th and 19th March to watch an episode of the TV series 'The Chosen'. There will be refreshments served beforehand, each show will last around an hour (followed by a discussion), attendance is free, and all are welcome.

The Chosen is a TV series written and produced by an independent Christian team in America, funded by the public through crowdfunding. This means there is no obligation to any commercial organisation and the series is freely available to all (via their website – details below). The initial plan raised only enough money to film four episodes, and all cast members (bar one) were unknown actors. Since then, four Seasons (of 6-8 episodes each) have been made and released, with Season Five due for release before Easter 2025. To date it has been watched worldwide (subtitled or dubbed) in 26 different languages, with more than 250 million views of at least one episode. It's a phenomenon!

Generally, the stories are fairly biblically accurate, but the organisation does say this: "The Chosen is based on the true stories of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Some locations and timelines have been combined or condensed. Back stories and some characters have been added. However, all Biblical content and any artistic imaginations are designed to support the truth and intention of the Scriptures. Viewers are encouraged to read the gospels."

Some of the comments about the show include: 'It's a must'. 'Makes you want to go back and read what it actually says in Scripture.' 'Gives breadth and depth to the stories' 'The portrayal of Jesus is particularly good treading the line between, and showing both, fully man and fully God.' 'It brings Scripture to life, it's living it with them, not just words'.

Come and see what all the excitement in the Christian community is all about regarding the show – make your own mind up! For more information contact Pat Fry or Tim Clifford.

It supports the wellbeing of people of all faiths or none, and encompasses a wider role within the community as an advocate and champion of the contribution older people make to society. At the same time, it encourages the wider church to celebrate and cherish older members of the congregation, as well as other members of the community.


