Liminal Spaces

The Temple in Jerusalem



Some years ago now, Rev Tom Stuckey, then Chairman of the District came to lead our worship on our Chapel Anniversary. He introduced me and probably others too, to the idea of 'liminal spaces'. That is a place or a time when you can feel closer to God. What Celtic Christianity often knew as 'thin places'.

As we approach Easter this year, we will, as usual, be inviting children from local schools into our sanctuary to experience life in the Temple forecourt (in Jerusalem), soon after the crucifixion. I have been type-caste for some years now as the Pharisee, overseeing access to the Temple and because this exercise involves 'active learning' (children enquiring) I realised that I needed to be able to answer any questions thrown at me . So I did my research!

Visitors to the Temple at the time of Jesus needed to obey 'purity' rules by first washing feet, then purchasing (using temple coinage) suitable bird-life for sacrifice to honour God (all part of the 'Easter Is' experience). This Temple was the 'liminal place' for the people, where they could be confident of encountering God. Back in Jewish history, travelling with Moses in the desert, God had been present in the Arc of the Covenant, which they carried with them. When Solomon built the temple, the Arc was placed within. So the Temple in Jerusalem became an important focus of 'pilgrimage' for God-fearing Jews. That Temple was soon to be raised to the ground by the occupying Roman armies.

In John Chapter 2, when asked by Jews, for a sign to prove his authority, 'Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days "......But the temple he had spoken of was his body." So to early Christians, and to us too, Jesus identifies himself as that liminal link with God. The question for us today is where can we meet him?

Where are your personal 'liminal spaces'? Perhaps it's in a favourite patch of countryside, a mountain top, a seaside or a woodland with all the sounds of nature around you? Or maybe it's your own garden, a comfortable corner of your home or a favourite church? It could be in music or art, or just a 'place in time', an incident which arrives out of the blue, which has, unexpectedly, alerted you to God's presence and God's peace. These are occasions that, at times, we all need.

I pray that your own faith may keep you in a state of awareness for these liminal moments. Nick Langham




WELCOME TO SPRING


